The Bookstore's sales total for October was \$1056.07. This was slightly below last October's \$1067.30 but over \$200 better than last month. The Internet Sales group's September profit was \$255, about half of last September. The combined group's total for October year-to-date was \$15616.20. This was \$651 better than the same period last year. Now that we have the new carpeting and shelving completed in the receiving room, we can accept more book donations and hopefully end the year on a high note.
