### Internet Sales Update

September was our most profitable month for 2021 grossing \$1156 for 45 books. In the first 15 days of October, 28 books were sold for \$340. Some of the more expensive books sold recently include: *Essentials of Computer Organization and Architecture* (\$80), a textbook currently used in college courses; *Greatest Artists* (\$145), a 2-volume leather bound set in a slipcase with illustrations from *MAD Magazine*; *Memoirs of Richard Nixon* (\$100), a leather-bound book with gilt-page edges. We still have almost 50 collectible Presidential biographies for sale, some autographed. If you have a history enthusiast in your family, these make great gift books.


### Meet Jerry Button. . . .
