In the past, there have been large donations given to the LFOP from the estates of generous library patrons, but never an amount as the most recent, unprecedented donation of \$460,549.04! Jerry McNamara, estate executor, came by the library on Friday, June 17th to present a very large check from the estate of long-time Payson resident, Frank Christopher. Mr. Christopher was a resident of Payson for over 30 years. He was a member of the Rim Country Flyers, a group of hobbyists who operate radio-controlled planes and boats, and he also enjoyed operating ham radios and hiking in the nearby forests.

Earlier in the week, another Payson resident donated \$2,700 in shares of stock to LFOP. Another past large donation was \$40,000 donated by Don Dedera's wife in memory of her husband requesting that it be used specifically for the Arizona Room. The room was re-named the "Don Dedera Memorial Arizona Room."

We are so appreciative and grateful for these legacy donations. If you are at the stage of planning your will or trust, please consider including the Payson Public Library as one of your beneficiaries.

We continue to receive donations as part of our annual fundraising initiative. As mentioned before, the Town of Payson covers employee salaries, building maintenance, office and janitorial supplies, and utilities. Cont'd on p. 5

Did you know....

The first circulating library in America was the Library Company of Philadelphia. Most Americans in the 1730s had limited access to books. Books, in early America, were rare and expensive. There were no public libraries. Only the very wealthy and the clergy had access to large numbers of books. Even men of moderate means could not readily afford books. Enter Benjamin Franklin.

On July 1, 1731, Franklin and a group of members from the Junto, a philosophical association, drew up "Articles of Agreement" to form a library. The Junto was interested in a wide range of ideas, from economics to solving social woes to politics to science. But they could not turn to books to increase their knowledge or settle disputes, as between them they owned few tomes. But they recognized that via the Junto's combined purchasing power, books could be made available to all members.

So it was that 50 subscribers invested 40 shillings each to start a library. Members also promised to invest 10 shillings more every year to buy additional books and to help maintain the library. They chose as their motto a Latin phrase which roughly translates as *To support the common good is divine.*FreedomSystem.com

While some women joined the military or entered the workforce, the majority stayed home to raise children. Diane's book focuses on the latter group. Their letters depict the country under wartime conditions. These resolute women had a significant effect on the outcome of the war and the well-being of the country. She has also written a non-fiction book on ravens, a bird commonly seen in our parks and yards.

November 20, 2023 (tentative): **Nancy E. Turner** returns to share her new book (published in 2020), *Light Changes Everything*. She visited Payson several years ago and brought her much-loved novels about a pioneer woman in the AZ Territory.

June Bookstore Sales Report

June was another good month for both the Bookstore and the Internet Sales. The Bookstore's revenue was \$835.03. This was better than last month and 25% better than last June. The year-to-date total of \$4685.78 is better than the same period last year by \$1016.69.

The Internet group's profit for the month was \$293.00. This was less than last month but \$196.00 better than the previous June. A book about Carlos Marcello, the Italian American crime boss from New Orleans, by Stefano Vaccara, sold for \$170.00. The profit for the first six months is \$2218.00.

The combined total was \$1128.03 for the month and \$6903.78 for the first half of the year.


