### **Donor Program Continues for 2024**

You already may have received a letter from us announcing our Donor Program fund drive for 2024. We are once again seeking support from our community to help the Payson Public Library continue to provide quality services and programs for Rim Country residents.

It is important to note that programs at the Library are NOT funded by municipal tax dollars, which are used specifically for employee salaries and building infrastructure. Only limited funding for programs is provided by the Gila County Library District. The great majority of funding is provided by The Library Friends of Payson. In the past fiscal year, the Library Friends provided over \$41,000 toward the purchase of new books, DVDs, audiobooks and program funding.

The Payson Public Library is a centerpiece of the Rim Country community and provides a welcoming environment to relax, visit with friends, attend a program or class, do research, play video games, or checkout the latest hit movie or bestselling novel. Books are what keeps many of us entertained, and the more books the better. Books can come in many different forms: print, audio, and e-books. If you have a laptop, a tablet or Kindle, or a smart phone, you can easily listen to audiobooks or read e-books and magazines on your electronic device. Using the Libby app, you can borrow audiobooks, ebooks, magazines, and more, and – here's the best part - it's all free. The app can be downloaded through either the Apple App Store or Google Play, depending on the type of operating system your electronic device uses.

First, you need a library card. If you don't have one, just stop by the Circulation Desk and sign up. You will need to have a photo ID and proof of residency. Then, on the Libby app, find the nearest library to you (you can let



Libby help you), which will usually be the Payson Public library in the Gila County Library District. Once you've made it this far, you sign in using your library card number (no spaces) and your PIN number. If you need a PIN number, the staff at the Circulation Desk can help you with that.

Now you are set to start looking for the book, audiobook, or magazine you want. The choices are almost endless. In addition to the Gila County Library District, you also have access to nine other libraries and library districts. If the item you want isn't available to be checked out, you can put the item on hold, and you will be notified when it becomes available. When you check out an item via Libby, you are given a due date which means the item will no longer be available to be viewed or listened to on your device after that date.

For more assistance with using Libby on your electronic devices, or to learn more about the features offered, just stop by the Payson library and ask one of the friendly staff for help. Be sure to bring your device with you.

There is always something new and fun happening at the library, so stop by soon and see all the amazing things the Payson library offers. Check it out!

The Internet group's profit for the month was \$252.00. This included a copy of *Washington and the American Republic* by Lossing, which sold for \$50. Year to date revenue is \$456.00.

The combined total was \$779.02 for the month and \$1535.02 for January and February.

## **Rim Country Readers**






